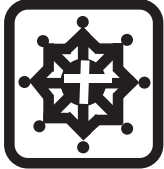

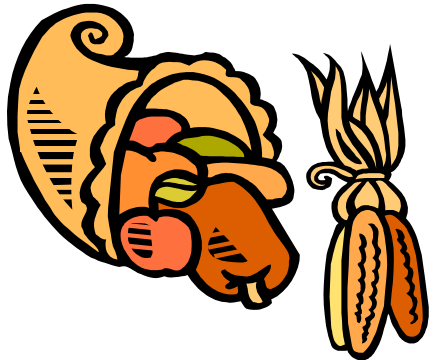

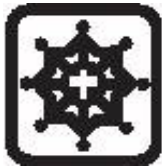

HIPPA, You & Your Pastor

As many of you know, the new act to insure patients' medical privacy, HIPPA, is in effect. When you enter the hospital, you will be asked if you would like your name placed on the hospital registry. If you say, "Yes," then the pastor will be able to access your information. If you say, "No," then the pastor will not be able to do so. The decision is yours.

Also, you will be asked if you want the pastor to be notified of your hospital admittance. Please remember that volunteers staff this communication, and, therefore, the pastor may not always be contacted in a timely fashion. If you want the pastor to know that you have been admitted, you or someone in your family or a friend should call the pastor with that information.

2008 FOOD STAMP BUDGET CHALLENGE

At the area Bread for the World Meeting held at our church Sunday, October 26th, we were provided with the following information:

13 million children who receive Food Stamps live on \$27 for the entire week for food. Could you? Take the 2008 Dayton Food Stamp Budget Challenge to see if you have what it takes:

1. On November 6-12, 2008, each person should only spend a total of \$27 on food and beverages during the Challenge week.
2. All food purchased and eaten during the Challenge week, including fast food and dining out, must be included in the total spending.
3. During the Challenge, only eat food that you purchase for the project. Don't eat food that you already own (this does not include spices and condiments). Do not accept free food from friends, family, or at work.
4. Consider making a monetary donation to the Jewish Federation of Greater Dayton's food pantry (jewishdayton.org/jcrc) or to Bread for the World (bread.org) of the excess dollars you would have spent on food in a "normal" week.
5. Please keep track of receipts on food spending and take note of your experiences throughout the week.

"News From our Pantry regarding local hunger."

We have already seen a dramatic increase in NEW FAMILIES coming into our Pantry. We have processed over 50 new families in the past two months. We served a record number, 52 families just this past week. This is double what was typically a busy week.

We ask for the churches support through grocery items, and monetary donations. We also seek and receive support from other area churches, and we see God working through all the various support avenues. **This Sunday is Pantry Sunday**, we especially need, **bath soap, TP, Soups other than Chicken noodle, canned peas, Spaghetti Sauce, canned meat products.** Thank you for being an active part of God's call to Love and Care for our neighbors.
