News from

the Missionary Health Service
February 2010 trip to Honduras.

For several years now our church through Mission Outreach has worked with this Medical group, originally developed out of the Springfield/Dayton area, in sponsoring two Honduran students for higher education beyond what the government provides. This Missionary Medical group mentors and guides this Scholarship student program, along with the medical services they provide to these villages.

Twice a year, in February and September they bring together a team of medical staff that travels to Honduras for a three week stay. Five Physicians, two Dentists, a Nurse Midwife, Pediatric Nurse, and three general Nurses, a Medical Lab Assistant, a Dental Hygienist, an Engineer and some special helpers provide a connection to better health care and better education and living.

Their Mission statement is: "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." - Matthew 25:40

#### By the numbers - Medically they:

Treated 1,283 medical patients 936 received parasite medication 742 Medical lab test were performed 3,555 Prescriptions were filled 25 pap smears were done.

269 Dental patients were seen, with 338 extractions, 58 exams and 18 restorations done.

And 42 teeth cleanings were given

The team met with mayors, teachers, and other leaders of the villages. They also met with every Scholarship student, discussing expectations and encouraging them in their studies. They have a total of 40 students in the program this year. Two recent graduates expressed their gratitude for their opportunity to be in the program. They mentioned the difference it has made in job opportunities to them. Instead of working in the fields they now have a job in an air conditioned office! One former student also returned to the village to speak to the current students. Rubin, who went on to University in San Pedro Sula is now a teacher.

Here at the church we have photos of our students and their classmates along with letters of thanks written by the students posted on the bulletin board. Also see the full newsletter that the Missionary Health Services group has sent, for more stories of how lives are changing for the better in Honduras through their work and faith.

It's summer again and we will begin to have special music during our 10:45 service. Everyone is invited to participate in this special time.


