Karl Keith our Montgomery County Auditor has sent out some property tax info on the Homestead exemption program.

This statewide program administered by the County Auditor offers senior citizen homeowners as well as homeowners who are permanently and totally disabled a reduction on their real property or manufactured home taxes.

On average those in the program save \$560 a year.

Homeowners turning 65 in 2011 have until June 6th to signup.
