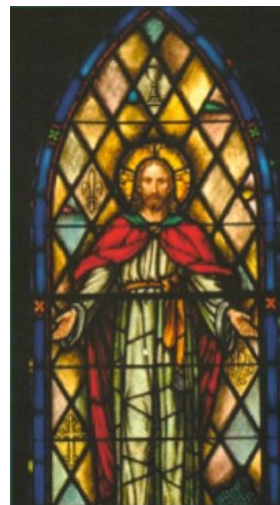

The Disciple's Prayer

Matthew 6:9-15

So, then, pray in this way:

Our Father in heaven, let your name be held holy:

Let your Kingdom come:

Let your will be done, as in heaven, so upon earth:

Give us to-day bread for the coming day:

Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors:

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the Evil One.

For, if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will forgive you too; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

The Lord's Prayer is specifically and definitely stated to be the disciple's prayer; it is meant to be prayed as committed disciples.

The first three petitions have to do with God and with the glory of God;

The second three petitions have to do with our needs and our necessities.

God's supreme place is first, and our needs and desires follow. It is only when God is given his proper place that all other things fall into their proper places. In praying the Lord's prayer, we must always seek to submit to God's will.

The second part of the prayer deals with our needs. It asks for bread, that is necessary to maintain our present life. It asks for forgiveness and brings the past into the presence of God. It asks for help in temptation and commits all the future into the hands of God. In these petitions we are taught to lay everything: past, present, and future into God's hands.

So we can bring our whole life to God, all of it. It also brings the whole of God to our lives. God the Father, God the Son, Jesus Christ our Savior and Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, Strengthener, the Guide and Guardian of our way. Jesus has taught us to bring our whole selves to God, and that God's wholeness is given to us.

This study of the Lord's Prayer is shared by Mike Robinson. He is sharing this study from the book "Less than a Chapter a Day" with Barclay Commentary on the prayer.

A Memorial service will be held here at the church at 1 PM on Friday, Sept. 22. A Tea reception will follow the service.

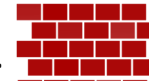
Donations of finger foods can be dropped off by 11 AM that day.
